




The main internationalization activities carried out by Sapienza are implemented at several levels, all closely related to each other:



International Researchers' Guide



Sapienza promotes incoming mobility of foreign scholars as **"visiting professors**" for <u>research</u> and <u>teaching</u>

- 1 Call for proposals per year
- Applicants: Sapienza's teachers and researchers interested in hosting a foreign scholar
- Period of stay: min 1 months, max 3 months
- Financial support for visiting professors ranges from € 3,000 to € 5,000 per month (before taxes)
- In the last 3 years Sapienza hosted 256 visiting professors coming from the top Universities and Research Centres in the world



RESEARCHERS MOBILITY AND EU PROGRAMMES UNIT Marie Curie and ERC Grants

Horizon 2020 is the biggest EU Research and Innovation programme ever with nearly € 80 billion of funding available over 7 years (2014 to 2020). Sapienza University participates in a wide range of international projects addressing didactics, research and cooperation, both as a coordinator and as a project partner.

Since 2017 this same unit manages funding also for young PhD candidates fostering their mobility according to specific interdisciplinary research projects (Youth Fund)

DEVELOPMENT COOPERATION UNIT

- Sapienza university resources
 - University annual Budget (every year funds for development aid programs, depending on budget availability, are approved), departmental resources, specific co-financing programs;

 Europeaid, Erasmus Mundus ACP project, other programs;
- Ministry of Foreign Affairs financial resources;
- Partnerships with private enterprises, associations, ngo's....

Developing Countries*

Total €500 = 1st instalment €150 + 2nd instalment €175 + 3rd instalment €175 + Regional Fee €140

Other Countries

Total €1.000 = 1st instalment €300 + 2nd instalment €350 + 3rd instalment €350 + Regional Fee €140

Bilateral Agreements for Student Exchange

A bilateral student mobility agreement is an understanding between Sapienza University of Rome and a non-EU institution aimed at exchanging Bachelor's, Master's and PhD students for study and/or thesis research (incoming and outgoing).

- Incoming students are allowed to spend from a minimum of 90 days to a maximum of two consecutive semesters at Sapienza without paying tuition fees + attending an Italian language course for free + welcome procedures by the International office. No scholarship provided.
- Outgoing students from Sapienza are selected by the faculty according to the requirements indicated by the partner Institution. They get a scholarship from the International Office and they are required to do the credit recognition at the end of their exchange

The student mobility agreement can also be signed in the absence of a framework agreement. The institution interested in signing it has to contact the <u>International Agreements Unit</u> and follow the specific procedure. Only afterwards it will be possible to sign the student mobility agreement.



Bilateral Agreements for Student Exchange – how to sign it

The agreement can be signed by the Dean of the <u>Faculty</u> or by the Rector, Prof. Antonella Polimeni, depending on how much flexibility is guaranteed to incoming and outgoing students in terms of educational activities (greater or lesser access to all degree programmes).

The duration of the agreement can be unlimited. However, it is possible to specify the expiry date if requested by the partner institution interested in signing.

Procedure:

- 1. check the academic offer available at Sapienza: https://corsidilaurea.uniroma1.it/en
- 2. send an email to martina.vizzani@uniroma1.it indicating:
- the name of the University and the country;
- the educational area of interest and whether you have already made previous contacts with one or more Sapienza professors.

The professors responsible for the indicated area will carefully evaluate the requests. Only with the support of one or more Sapienza professors will the International Office be able to follow up the negotiation.

IHEA Foundation

- In October 2020 Sapienza University signed the deed of incorporation of the IHEA Foundation 'Italian Higher Education with Africa', set up together with the Polytechnic University of Milan, the Alma Mater Studiorum - University of Bologna, the University of Florence, the University of Naples Federico II and the University of Padua.
- The Foundation is aimed at promoting the internationalisation of Italian universities in Africa and contributing to local development with a view to cooperation, through developing education and training for students living in African countries and promoting support and refresher courses for personnel and academic staff of local universities.

Specifically, the universities that are part of the Foundation aim to:

- enable virtual mobility for African students in the first and second semesters of the 2020-21 academic year;
- activate a first-level inter-university Advanced Professional Course (60 ECTS) starting from the 2021-22 academic year, inspired by the 2030 Agenda and Agenda 2063, dedicated to young researchers and lecturers from African partner universities;
- activate a Bachelor's degree programme.



IHEA Foundation – Virtual Mobility

- The virtual mobility programme has been the first project launched in the second semester 2020-2021 within the framework of the IHEA Foundation.
- Bilateral agreements have been signed between Italian universities, Foundation members, and interested
 African universities. These specific virtual mobility agreements provide for selecting a prearranged number of
 African students who are offered the opportunity to participate in specific online courses organised by Italian
 universities.
- We signed a bilateral agreement for virtual mobility with Uganda Christian University, Uganda –
 Stellenbosch University, South Africa Saint Francis University College of Health and Allied Sciences (SFUCHAS), Tanzania
- African universities taking part in the initiative have selected their own students interested in attending distance learning courses. At the end of the exchange period, an academic transcript will be issued upon passing the exams.
- We got 6 nominations but no students have passed the exams
